Husson University pre-pharmacy students begin as first-year students in the Health Sciences degree program. They may then apply for admission to the professional phase during their second year of study.

Students are required to take courses in the sciences with emphasis on biology, chemistry and math. Additional courses are included to fulfill Husson University's general education requirements and prepare students for the four-year professional pharmacy program.

*Husson students are offered guaranteed admission to the pharmacy program if they meet the following criteria:

- Math/science pre-pharmacy GPA of 2.75 or greater.
- PCAT composite score of 20th percentile or higher.
- Completion of a successful interview.

The School of Pharmacy is accredited by the Accreditation Council for Pharmacy Education (ACPE).
