Husson University and Southern Maine Community College (SMCC) have entered into an agreement that will create a smooth process for the transfer of credits from SMCC to Husson. The signing ceremony, representing the culmination of the agreement process, took place on Tuesday, July 1, 2014 on the SMCC South Portland Campus. For SMCC students, the agreement includes programs in computer science, computer technology and other fast-growing fields that promise students bright futures. SMCC is enhancing its information technology programs with a new state-of-the-art computer lab equipped with the latest technology. "This agreement allows students to pre-plan their college careers so they can avoid taking unneeded credits and spending money on courses that won't count toward a bachelor's degree." said College of Business Dean Marie Hansen. "In reaching this understanding, our two institutions have made it possible for students interested in completing a Bachelor's degree with Husson University to benefit from a more seamless credit transfer process at both the Bangor and Westbrook campuses."

Dean Hansen also signed two articulation agreements at the University of Maine at Presque Isle that increase transferability for UMPI students who want to continue their education in two of Husson's master's degree programs—Master of Science in Criminal Justice Administration and its Master of Business Administration. Where a typical course of study would take 4 years for a bachelor's degree and 2 years for a master's degree, these '4+1' agreements will allow UMPI students to complete their two degrees in as little as 5 years. "This agreement allows students to pre-plan their college careers extending to a master's degree. "

Michael Knupp says that his ultimate plan is to turn the boards over the Tech Club and let the students learn by

creating and managing projects.

Director and Associate Professor Dr. Tom Fitzpatrick recently took 22 students to China as part of BA 499 and BA 799, Business & Culture in China. This was in conjunction with EF College Study Tours. Dr. Fitzpatrick and his students spent 12 days sightseeing and immersing themselves in China's history, economics, and culture. The trip involved visits to major multinational corporations, cultural activities, and lectures from Chinese University business faculty. Cities visited included Beijing, Badaling, Shanghai, and Hong Kong. Dr. Fitzpatrick has been named Global Scholar for 2014 at Husson University.
